From the Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

One of the other highlights of my trip to England was on the Sunday after Corpus Christi when we drove up to London for a three mile procession from the Church of the Assumption and St Gregory to St James, Spanish Place. I have had the grace in my life to participate in the Corpus Christi procession in some pretty awesome places: Taylors (!), Rome, Vienna, New York, a Carmelite convent in Nebraska, Florence, Montpellier. But what made this different? The historical import. Even as late as 50 years ago, it was illegal for Catholics to have public processions in England. Some parishes might have a small discreet one around the parish grounds but even that was discouraged for fear of exposing Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament to sacrilege and blasphemy. English Catholics have historically been very reserved and private about their faith, partially as a reaction to centuries of social exclusion and being seen as a distinctly un-English segment of society.

But this procession now takes place with all of the glory and majesty proper to the Eucharistic King of Kings. I was happy to see some lay and priest friends I had not seen in a while in the procession, and also the huge crowds of people who came out for it. It was interesting to watch the people on the sidewalks: many people obviously had no idea what we were doing. The secularization and Islamization of modern Britain is so total that many people can't even recognize a Catholic priest or liturgical service. I expected protesters from the Protestant League, but none came. Many people looked on in interest as the thousands made their way singing and praying, as clouds of incense from four large thuribles (and you think Prince of Peace is bad!) covered the air with the perfume of holiness.

My friend, Father Bradley, pointed out with as much emotion as a good Englishman can muster, that as we walked through Oxford Street and Regent Street, we were tracing the same steps as the hundreds of priests, nuns, men and women who were led through those streets on their way to Tyburn, where they were hanged, drawn and quartered for their belief that bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ at the Mass. We had the privilege to walk with Our Lord through the streets of London with pride and joy while our ancestors in the faith were denied the right to live because they shared the same religion. Incidentally, Tyburn, where the saints met their death, is now home to a convent of Benedictine nuns who pray and make reparation for the sins of their countrymen. The canopy above the altar is in the shape of a gallows, a poignant reminder of the sacrifice of the martyrs above the place of Eucharistic sacrifice.

Never take the Mass for granted, and never take as a given the freedom we have to worship and exercise our Catholic faith privately and publicly. England was called Mary's Dowry, it was so Catholic, and all it took was a generation of revolutionaries and complacent people to destroy the faith. After centuries of sacrifice and martyrs, the Catholic Church in England is not numerous, but does have a particular beauty. We do well to know that history and honor it!
